In 1973, Anduhyaun was established as Canada's first Aboriginal women's emergency shelter and in 1995 Anduhyaun added a supportive housing facility, Nekenaan Second Stage Housing, to its services. Anduhyaun exists to support Aboriginal women and their children in their efforts to maintain cultural identity, self-esteem, economic, physical and spiritual well-being.

If you have experience or education in governance, strategic planning or leadership and you have a strong desire to serve the Indigenous community, Anduhyaun is now inviting expressions of interest from individuals across the GTA who would like to volunteer as Members of the Circle of Directors. Persons with lived experience facing homelessness and/or fleeing violence are strongly encouraged to apply.

Anduhyaun is seeking to fill Circle vacancies with thought leaders who:

- Are Indigenous or are well versed in Indigenous allyship;
- Have experience providing support or advocacy to those facing poverty;
- Demonstrate a commitment to creating lasting change to those who have experienced violence; and,
- Can commit to monthly meetings and participate on sub-committees and/or working groups to support and advance the agency's strategic goals.

Currently, the agency is seeking those who may have particular professional experience in the areas of financial management and/or legal expertise.
