President's Verbal Report – Wanda Whitebird

This last year at Anduhyaun has been an exciting one. And although we have had some changes in our staff, it's been a special year.

One of the things that has happened is that our Board of Directors has grown larger and I'm so excited about that. So excited about the Board of Directors' that serves with me and the talent and the strengths and the dedication that they bring for our women; it's great to be a part of. I would like to thank all of the Board members who have been here with us this year. Thank you for all your hard work; coming to the meetings and expressing who you are and being there and bringing those gifts.

As well as the staff that have worked really hard. We have truly never recovered from closing our daycare and that was about seven years ago. They know we don't have any extra program dollars. We don't have any extra money in those senses as everything goes to the needs that we need to meet. So a great big thank you to all of them, especially Blanche who keeps us on track.

We have had some fundraising efforts which were really awesome. We have a fundraising committee, which is really exciting and Deborah Graham is the chair. We had an event called Strawberry Moon Fundraiser during June and it was awesome. I truly appreciate the efforts and the time everyone put into that. The community came out to the event, as well. Maxine Noel was amazing. Anduhyaun's mandate to keep women safe, when we do things we have to be really careful about how we do things for confidentiality, because violence is something that we live with in our lives. So it is very hard for us to do fundraising because we want to make sure that we never jeopardize the safety of our women. So big galas aren't going to work in that sense, as we need to make sure our women are safe.

It's been tough. We are going to continue on into the next year, hoping to decrease the deficit that we had when we closed the daycare. And then move on to bigger and better things and to increase our capacity. We haven't been able to look at specific needs of the community because we are just maintaining the purpose of why we gather. So every bit that you donate including every hour and every dollar is greatly appreciated as it goes directly to the women.

I want to say thank you for the staff and the Board members who helped me. We wouldn't be where we are without the staff and their hard work and dedication.

Executive Director's Report – Blanche Meawassige

It has been an exciting year. Exciting in the sense that we achieved the following, to name a few:

- For the first time, tobacco seeds were planted (later harvested). The seeds were gifted to Anduhyaun by Joce Tremley, The Stop's Farmers' Market, Artscape Wychwood Barns
- The second floor, Nekenaan Second Stage Housing (NSSH) was rented to the City of Toronto to operate a daycare
- Mno Bimaadiziwin Draw was held where \$9,000.00 was raised to purchase Client items, such as, mattresses, blankets, clothes and TTC tokens
- Cash donations exceeded last year's contributions
- Volunteerism rose as well – from 5 the previous year to 21.

To Anduhyaun donors and funders we appreciate your ongoing support. In particular, Homelessness Partnership Strategy (HPS); MCSS, Miziwe Biik Aboriginal Employment and Training; Toronto Social Housing Unit (TSHU), the Rotary Club of Etobicoke; York University and J. Victor Parker.

I wish to thank, the volunteer Board of Directors and my colleagues for their ongoing support, feedback and guidance.

As we welcome Deborah Brant, Housing Administrator Assistant (Miziwe Biik Training Program) and Robin Chenevert-Keays, Housing Administrator to the team, we say farewell to Star Nahwegahbo, Housing Administrator, and wish her well in her studies.

Community partnerships play a vital role in our service delivery where the Client is the beneficiary. For instance, we partnered with Kids Upfront whose Mission reads:

“Kids Up Front Foundation is a charitable organization that provides access to arts, culture, sport and recreation for children who don’t have the opportunity to experience them.”

Our young clients have had the opportunity to attend hockey and baseball games, concerts and plays.

Shelter Report – Pamela Hart & Lisa Powell

This past fiscal year the shelter has serviced 298 women and 37 children within the Shelter. This past fiscal we saw that women were staying longer and working on their care plans while we offered a safe and secure place to reside while gaining resources, being provided counselling and life skills workshops. The Outreach programs serviced 475 women, and 55 women have secured permanent housing.

We have had the great honour of having elders, grandmothers and teachers provide circles and ceremony to our women and children thus providing an opportunity to reconnect with one’s culture.

During the past year we have had the pleasure of experiencing compassion and generosity of many, including the students from York University in Professor Peter Dawson’s classes. These students have continued to work to raise awareness about the barriers our Indigenous women and children face. Furthermore they donated supplies and workshops for the children each week, including revamping the play room with new paint and toys.

We would like to acknowledge the Etobicoke Rotary Club and Basketeers, for their continued commitment to our Clients by way of donations. Anduhyaun Shelter would also like to thank the Ministry of Community and Social Services for their continued funding and support, City Hall for their kind support through the Shoebox Project, which provided personalized gifts for Christmas time. We would also like to include and acknowledge all the individual kindness from various community members that have gave back to us in some way and their continued support through donations and awareness sharing.

The STOP Community Centre gifted sacred medicine plants and their time in assisting residents and staff in producing a memory garden and mural to honour all Missing and Murdered Indigenous Women and for all those who have entered and moved on from our Shelter.

We would like to thank our staff for their ongoing support in assisting our clients on their personal journey.

Nekenaan Second Stage Housing Report – Robin Chenevert-Keays

The past fiscal year has once again been very rewarding and busy here at Nekenaan. Over the past year we have maintained an average occupancy rate of 86%. We welcomed 13 new households and helped 10 families move from Nekenaan to permanent and or affordable housing. At the end of our fiscal year, March 31st 2017 we had a total 18 families occupying 22 units with a 96% occupancy rate and no arrears.

A special thank you to ALFDC – HPS funding. There have been several improvements here at Nekenaan, including placing standard sized refrigerators in the single units. This allows tenants to store more food, save money, and reduce theft. As well, the common room stoves have also been upgraded and replaced. The second floor has been rented to the City of Toronto for use as a daycare.

With the addition of the Housing Administrator Assistant position, our ability to assist the new and existing clients has greatly increased. Nekenaan's successes and growth will always be reflected best in the lives of the women and children who come to live here. As we continue to grow and change, there will be challenges to face, but, we will become

stronger and wiser because of them. I look forward to working together with our Nekenaan staff, to continue to provide support to the women and children who access our services

Director of Resident Support Services Report – Cathi Porciello

The DRSS strives to meet Anduhyaun's mandate, and with this focus, there has been ongoing growth this year in programming and tenant supports.

On a monthly basis, the DRSS services an average of 18 – 22 women, and hosts approximately 2 to 4 programs. 10 residents secured permanent housing this fiscal year.

Programming has been focused on providing traditional teachings from Traditional Teachers/Elders. Other programming has included healthy eating community cooking, children's programming with Mt Dennis branch of the Toronto Library, an onsite food bank and an onsite clothing bank. New initiatives include a resource room with computer access for the residents, a Housing Support worker coming from Native Women's Resource Center of Toronto (NWRCT) monthly to Nekenaan, and now Ojibwe language is being used in written and spoken forms during some workshops. Also a Reiki practitioner is donating her services on a monthly basis.

New relationships or partnerships with agencies or organizations continue to be created, along with nurturing existing ones. For example, we were approved a second term as ROMCAN partners which results in 500 free admissions annually to the Royal Ontario Museum. Relationships that support housing searches continue to be a primary focus in maximizing existing resources and researching new ones.

A special mention for a long-time volunteers and supporters of Anduhyaun goes to Gillian Dugas, her husband Andre, and their family, especially grandson Lincoln. Gill was recognized by receiving a Legacy Award from Volunteer Toronto for all the volunteer work that she and her family do. We, at Anduhyaun are grateful recipients of the amazing gifts the family put together, from baking beautiful cupcakes for the clients on Mother's Day, to gathering 12 bins of new clothing for the clothing bank on site at Nekenaan. Plus so much more. We are so grateful for their long standing passion for giving to the tenants and clients we serve.

We have to say farewell to our Housing Administrator, Star Nahwegahbo, as she decided to move on to further her education. We thank her for her time of dedicated service, and wish her well on her new path.

The next year is anticipated with optimism and excitement. There is much gratitude and appreciation for the direction and support of Anduhyaun's Executive Director, Blanche

Meawassige, and the Board of Directors. Along with a passionate dedicated management team whom I have the honour to work with, I look forward to the next year.

On behalf of my fellow Board members, welcome to our Annual General Meeting.

As we have stated before, we are sure Anduhyaun's original Grandmothers, Vera Martin, Mildred Redmond, Mary Jane Young and Jeannette Lavell, and signatories of our Letters Patent, March 12th 1973, would be pleased that our circle continues to remain strong. The strong circle is evident in Cathy Pawis and Wanda Whitebird both of whom have shared their wisdom and experience as volunteer Board members since 2005. Thank you Cathy and Wanda for your generosity of spirit.

The Greater Toronto Area's, GTA, lack of permanent affordable housing is an ongoing Client concern, especially when waiting lists can be 5 years or more. We are pleased to report that our second stage housing's occupancy rate is approximately 71%, and that we assisted 26 Clients in acquiring permanent housing this year.

You will also see from Steve Silverberg's, Auditor's report, our efforts to remain within budget have proven to be modestly successful.

Thank you to the Ministry of Community and Social Services (MCSS), Toronto Social Housing Unit (TSHU), and Homelessness Partnership Initiative (HPI), for the administrative support and funding. We extend special thanks and gratitude to those who have donated time, items and finances this past year; to name a few, Unifor 112, the Rotary Club of Etobicoke and Basketeers.

It has been a busy year for our dedicated 7 member Fundraising Committee. Our objectives were to increase our fundraising efforts through events and partnerships. For example, in the spring, we partnered with Vesey's Seeds and raised a modest sum through the sale of garden bulbs. Also, we held two fundraising events, one, our first Annual Strawberry Moon Fundraiser; second, an online Winter Campaign, for both events we raised **\$9,818.35**. In March of this year, we hosted a donor appreciation evening, Friends of Anduhyaun, for our donors and sponsors.

A special thanks to our Executive Director, Blanche Meawassige for her continued efforts to secure a new shelter. For the upcoming year, we will continue our fundraising efforts and our quest for a new shelter.

We hope you will join us in our efforts to raise awareness and bringing an end to Gender-Based Violence, Murder and Missing Indigenous Women, Human Trafficking and violence against children.

Last but not least, I would like to thank all staff who remain dedicated to our mandate and my fellow Members of the Board, fundraising committee for their ongoing dedication and hard work.

To Anduhyaun's donors and funders we appreciate your ongoing support, notably, Ministry of Community Social Services (MCSS), Homelessness Partnering Strategy (HPS), Miziwe Biik Aboriginal Employment and Training; Toronto Social Housing Unit (TSHU), The Rotary Club of Etobicoke; Unifor 112; and Indigenous and Northern Affairs Canada (INAC).

In 2016, Ontario (MCSS) launched a strategy to end human trafficking. Later, MCSS partnered with the Ontario Native Women's Association to establish the Indigenous Anti-Human Trafficking Liaisons and requested a call for proposals, to which Anduhyaun responded and was successful. For the remainder of 2018, Anduhyaun will conduct a feasibility study led by co-team leaders Bonnie Johnston and Tsitra McKay. Bonnie and Tsitra will engage the community to assess the need for wrap-around services.

With the financial support of HPS and the City of Toronto, a number of minor capital upgrades and purchases were completed, such as:

- Nekenaan has a fully accessible unit and is AODA compliant
- Replacement of small appliances
- Re-pavement of driveway

In addition to the above, HPS also supported Anduhyaun in providing culturally appropriate programming. Programming that holds fast to Anduhyaun's belief that Traditional healing and knowledge is not only a way of life but path that is fundamental to one's life journey.

To the Board of Directors, thank you for bringing your passion, intellect, insight, experience and resources to the table. To staff for their service and dedication to those we serve. Finally to my colleagues, thank you for sharing your gift of humour, experience and kindness.

Of the 157 women served 16 were successful in securing permanent housing. The Outreach programs have jointly serviced 349 women and 13 children.

The past fiscal year has once again been very rewarding and busy here at Nekenaan. Over the past year we have maintained an occupancy rate of 71%. We welcomed 10 new households and helped 10 families move from Nekenaan to permanent and or affordable housing. At the end of our fiscal year, March 31st 2018 we had a total 18 families occupying 22 units with a 75% occupancy rate and no arrears.

There have been several improvements here at Nekenaan. With support from the Homelessness Partnering Strategy (HPS), high powered fans and new microwaves for all the units were purchased. With a grant from HPS we also repaved the driveway, adding a more accessible front entrance and walk way. We replaced all toilets, renovated the main office, the 6th floor offices, the basement activity room, and kitchen with new flooring, and a fresh coat of paint.

One major improvement we were able to achieve this year, is our new accessible unit. Thanks to the generous grant we received from the City of Toronto, we were able to renovate one of our current units into an accessible unit. This unit can accommodate a woman and a child. It includes a brand new bathroom, mobility beds, specially designed kitchen and furniture for clients with accessibility needs. This will only enhance our ability to provide more options to women fleeing violence and who need this accommodation.

With the addition of the Housing Administrator Assistant position, our ability to assist the new and existing clients has greatly increased. Nekenaan's successes and growth will always be reflected best in the lives of the women and children who come to live here. As we continue to grow and change, there will be challenges to face, but, we will become stronger and wiser because of them. I look forward to working together with our Nekenaan staff, to continue to provide support to the women and children who access our services.
